PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The Delta Kappa Gamma (DKG) Society International promotes professional and personal growth of women educators and excellence in education. On May 11, DKG will celebrate 93 years of making a difference for women educators. On May 22, Alpha Beta will celebrate 74 years of recognizing key women educators in our area and of making a difference for teachers, women, and children in the communities we serve.

The chapter exists thanks to each of you who continue to support the mission and values of DKG as well as the goals and focus of Alpha Beta. Did you know that the 48 members who currently comprise Alpha Beta have a combined total of 1,122 years of membership? Three (3) of our members have been members for 50 or more of those 74 years! Eleven (11) members have between 30 and 49 years of membership. We have 17 with 16 to 29 years of membership, 10 with six to 15 membership years, and seven with one to five years of membership. The diversity we have in the chapter keeps us relevant, vital, and vibrant. Diversity such as:

- member years;
- those active in the field and those retired;
- those involved in pre-K education, elementary/middle/high school, and those involved at the collegiate level; and,
- early career educators and those who are veterans in the classroom.

Projects such as fleece blankets, weekend backpack programs, Schools for Africathe Jabulani School, collections for Bedford County Children and Youth Services, funding our Grant-in-Aid program, funding our Teacher Enrichment Grants, helping our partner Girl Scout Troop earn STEM badges, Beyond the Classroom project for those teachers transitioning to something different, Talk About Teaching project for early career educators, Key Women Educator recognition – to name a few. Know that by engaging in these projects we honor our 12 Founders and our chapter charter members and we keep the mission and vision of DKG relevant in today's society.

We add to the legacy and history of DKG every day through our active involvement in the chapter and by maintaining our membership in DKG. Without you - your energy, your drive, your passion, and your ideas – none of what we do would happen. The difference we are making in the communities we serve would not happen. The amazing thing is to know how their spirits, even in difficult times, are so positive and kind.

I should add a personal note since this note is coming to you from New York! You may know that Jim and I had been thinking about moving to a retirement community to be nearer our daughter and her family who live outside of Albany. The plan was to move in about 2 years. However, when a young family was eager to buy our home, it just seemed like we were to make the move sooner than we expected. US. FORUM

Current pending legislation includes PA House Bill 2413. It was introduced on 3-16-22 and referred to the House Education Committee.

Summary of the pending bill--- a Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the PA Constitution to further provide for the maintenance and support of public education.

Highlight of the proposed amendment ---Education spending by the Commonwealth shall be allocated to individual students to attend the schools that best fit the students needs.

GIRL SCOUTS and STEM



State President, Eileen Little, has a passion for STEM (science, technology, engineering, mathematics) and STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts, mathematics) and has encouraged chapters to pursue projects related to STEM and STEAM. Our chapter is committed to helping the scouts in the Roaring Spring Girl Scout Troop 43009 earn badges in STEM through STEM-related work sessions.



One such session was held on February 27, 2022, when nine scouts participated in a presentation on the Women of STEM. Session #2 was held on March 20, 2022 and 10 scouts visited stations where they worked with a



green screen, created movies with Stikbots, created jewelry using binary codes, and participated in our chapter's Spaghetti Challenge. For the Challenge, teams had to create the tallest free-standing structure topped off with a marshmallow using only 20 sticks of spaghetti, a foot of masking tape, a foot of string, and their ingenuity. Team work, collaboration, communication, critical thinking, and logic helped each team complete the challenge successfully. The tallest structure built was 18".
