US FORUM

House of Representatives Bill 4259 is another Legislation to watch. This bill was approved 31-0 by the House Committee on Education and Workforce. It is aging to the floor of the US House for consideration. If the bill passes, schools would be required to notify parents of students with disabilities that they can invite people with additional knowledge or expertise to participate in individualized education program meetings. These individuals can be people who know the student personally, or who have expertise regarding the special education services that would be appropriate for this student.

In 1948 there was no December meeting. Following the October meeting, the chapter did not meet again until February 1949. More about that later....

The first December chapter meeting was held on December 18, 1952 at the Fort Bedford Inn. President Thelma Morse presided at the meeting. Twenty sisters were in attendance. According to the minutes, "The highlight of the evening was the initiation of Miss Margaret H. Lessig." Also, the members exchanged gifts for which each member paid \$1.00.

It is interesting to note the similarities and differences between then and now. Some things remain the same and others change, but we remain committed to one another in "genuine spiritual fellowship."

Then they are sent off to start their day with a spritz of perfume for the girls or body spray for the boys. Lisa has noticed that the program has really helped her connect with the preschoolers to second grade children in her building and Lisa has many students who return multiple times to take part in the program.
