# President's Message from Becky Johnen

In her book, <u>Things I Wish I'd Known Sooner: Personal Discoveries of a Mother of Twelve</u>, (Edwards, 1997), Jaroldeen Edwards relays a story of visiting her daughter. While taking her daughter to the garage to pick up a car, they take a detour along a mountain road. Edwards describes how they turned a corner and saw, from the top of the mountain, sloping for several acres across folds and valleys, rivers of daffodils in radiant bloom. She describes it as a profusion of color that blazed before them like a carpet and looking as if the sun tipped over and spilled gold down the mountainside. At the center of this scene, purple hyacinths were like a cascading waterfall. Coral colored tulips were sprinkled throughout.

Edwards wondered who had created such beauty, why, and how? A sign at the center of the property indicated that 'One woman, two hands, two feet, and very little brain, one at a time, started in 1958' had been responsible for that scene of beauty. Edwards relays that she was moved by what she had seen and by the realization that the woman who created the beautiful flower garden had changed the world one bulb at a time.

This story reminds me of how we in Alpha Beta and in DKG change things, often one project at a time, one idea at a time, one person at a time, or as those in our partner Girl Scout Troop say, "...one knot at a time." Little by little, the good works that we do add up to create magic and 'things of beauty' for someone.

Our fleece blanket project brings magical comfort to those who have been victims of domestic violence and/or sexual assault. Our Grant-in Aid program offers magical financial support to education majors in their last two years of collegiate study. Our Fellowship Connection and Remembrances Committees provide magical words of cheer to our members needing a little boost. Our support of the Jabulani School in Zimbabwe, Africa has created a place where magical educational experiences take place and

our continued support will nourish those students so they can create magic with their newfound knowledge. And, one of our newest projects, the Weekend Backpack Program, will add to the magic our local school districts are creating in providing food to those students who are in "food insecure" families.

Each of these ventures connects us to one or more of the DKG purposes, one or more of the Pennsylvania State Organization initiatives, to the goals and objectives in our strategic action plan, and to my theme for the biennium "creating magical connections...endless new possibilities." The possibilities for the chapter that may result from all of our efforts, projects, and ventures is sure to grow the profession, change education in our community, and grow the chapter (in membership and scope). I remain grateful to all of you for your commitment, energy, and enthusiasm and I am excited about who we are, what we are doing, and the magic we will be creating in the communities we serve!

In a nutshell: Categories for submission include:

- Literary efforts: Original essay, play-writing, poetry, short story
- Performance art: Dance, dramatics, film-making, music original composition, oratory
- Two-dimensional art: Acrylic, charcoal, color pencil, graphite, oil, pastel, pen and ink, print-making, watercolor
- Three-dimensional art: Basketry, ceramics, jewelry, pottery, quilts, sculpture, textiles, wood-carvings, installation, mixed media 3D
- Photography: Black and white, color
- Mixed media

Descriptions of each category are available on the DKG website. After signing in, click on the APPLY/SUBMIT tab and once in that section, click on the ART GALLERY SUBMISSIONS area and you will find submissions procedures, rubrics for each category, and the submission form. The Spring Gallery date is February 15, 2021 if you need more time.
