Fast forward to March. After Zoom meetings, numerous emails, and reminders to members, the *Books and Bargains* sale was finally coming together. A local Boy Scout troop was willing to help with setup. Chapter members brought car loads of items to our chapter meeting. More items were dropped off at Becky's, Royce's and my house and inquiries sparked by the publicity on the radio, newspaper and social media were answered.

When this project was suggested, it was beyond our imaginations that the volume of

### A Moment in History

Alpha Beta Chapter was organized by Blanche Foster, President, Alpha Alpha State 1946 – 48. The ceremony was conducted in Parlor A at the Bedford Springs Hotel on May 22, 1948. The initiation was conducted by Blanche Foster, State President, assisted by Dorothy Felton, Belle Oberheim, and Martha Stailey, who had been initiated on May 1, 1948, by Alpha chapter at the State Convention in Hershey. At the organization meeting following the initiation, Rosalind Mowry was elected president.

The Charter Members of Alpha Beta were: Ruth Brice, Rosalind Mowry, Irma C. Diehl, Grace E. Rankin, Martha N. Stailey, Stella M. Ritchey, Dorothy G. Felton, Dorothy P. Giles, Sara B. Gloor, Evelyn D. Miller, Sara G. Palmer, Belle Isle Oberheim, Ruth C. Rorar, Madolyn B. Taylor, and Mabel Holderbaum. Since the group was small, many meetings were held in members’ homes.

Our connection to Alpha Delta, Somerset, developed early. The first joint venture was a dessert meeting at Ye Olde Inn, Jennerstown, followed by attendance at a play at the Mountain Play House. The second venture was a joint meeting held October 20, 1948 at the New Hoffman Hotel in Bedford. It was the was a dinner meeting with the ladies from Somerset as guests of Alpha Beta.
