President's Message

As we get ready for our 2022-2023 DKG year, I plan to continue the theme I used during my first biennium: Making magical connections...endless new possibilities. Possibilities – the chance that somethings may happen. Some of the possibilities, the things I would like to see happen include: creating community connections that help with our name recognition and lead to us getting new members; having a successful community fundraiser that provides additional funds for our Grant-in-Aid and our Teacher Enrichment Grants; reaching many early career educators with our Talk About Teaching sessions; helping soon-to-be-retired educators with their plans for the next phase of their life journey; being responsive to local school districts' needs so we make a difference for education in the communities we serve; being seen as a resource for schools and other agencies helping women, children, and education; having everyone in the chapter continue to share their talents; and, having fun and getting to know each other better.

Thinking about these possibilities, I flashed on mountain men and the "possibles bags" that they each carried. Mountain men were trappers and explorers who lived in the wilderness. They were most common in the North American Rocky Mountains from about 1810 through the 1880s. Many mountain men were employed by Fur Trading companies to trap beaver and other animals for their fur (think Jim Bridger and Kit Carson). When trapping was no longer lucrative mountain men served as guides for the pioneers making their way west.

Considering the life of mountain men, it was necessary that critical items be carried at all times, so a staple of a mountain man became the "possibles bag." The "possibles bag" contained everything that could possibly be needed for the

day: black powder, powder measurer, flint and steel, lead balls, knives, and some personal items. Other items might include tools for trap repair, tobacco, sugar, and items to trade with indigenous people. While several items were common to all "possibles bags," every bag had its own unique contents that reflected the character of its owner.

Just as the mountain men needed to carry with them at all times everything they would need for the day, so too should we carry with us things we need to help us make magical connections which lead



Tina Smith-Gilbert was awarded the Nancy Grove Visionary Award at state convention in June 0f 2022. The \$500.00 award was granted to help fund two early literacy projects in Tina's PreK Counts classroom for



the 2022-2023 school year. The first project will help purchase a set of 9 books for each student in her classroom. One book will be given each month the child

attends school and each book selections will be based on each individual child's likes and interests. Each book will include a sticker letting the family know that the book purchase was funded by Pennsylvania State and was made possible by the Nancy Grove Visionary Award. Parents will be offered a parental involvement opportunity where they will be trained on the importance of reading to their children and exposing them to ways to enhance the reading experiences with their children.

Second, the Novel Effect App was also purchased for use in the classroom. The app will be used to enhance engagement of the preschool students during circle time oral reading activities in the classroom. The application is designed to follow along with the person reading and adds interactive music

and sound effects to the story. Many stories are available on the site and those stories cover a large age range and offer many genres. The application helps to create magical moments when you read aloud to your child/children.

Just an FYI for the good of the group ... If you download the free mobile app on the App Store or Google Play you can enjoy 5 read-a-louds each month and no subscription is required. The website also offers teachers a discounted rate for a year's subscription to the service.

The Washington State Organization developed the resolution "On Recognizing Mental Health Issues for Educational Staff and Promoting Support Services". The resolutions include promoting

destigmatization of mental illness through dissemination of information on successful school-based treatment programs, supports, and other resources.
