## A Moment in History

#### Pat Harrison Historical Records Chair

Following the initiation of our chapter on May 22, 1948, the 15 charter members got down to the business of being a chapter. The first regular meeting was held in September 1948 at the home of the president, Rosalind Mowry.

At that meeting money was collected for the relief of the Vanport teachers and dues were collected from 13 of the 15 members. The President appointed chairmen for 11 committees. After some discussion, the membership determined that the project for the year would be: Delta Kappa Gamma, its meaning, and activities.

In addition, our founders were eager to be involved with meetings outside of the chapter. The first was with the Somerset Chapter on September 28, 1948 for dessert and a play. The second was planning to be with the Altoona Chapter in April 1949. They also planned to invite the Somerset Chapter as their guests for a dinner meeting at the Hoffman Hotel on October 20, 1948. And, they made plans to attend the Wellsboro Regional Meeting on October 9, 1948.

The second vice president, Miss Stella Ritchey, invited the chapter to meet at her home in February 1949. Her invitation was gladly accepted.

What a productive meeting. After all that work, the members enjoyed delicious refreshments provided by the President.

## JOINT MEETING WITH ALPHA DELTA

Our May meeting with members of Alpha Delta, held at the Somerset Country Club, was a very nice event.


