## INTERNATIONAL WEBSITE (dkg.org)

Have you checked out the updated International website (dkg.org) which was launched on January 17 ?

It has been redesigned to be more user friendly and user focused. Information available when the site is first pulled up is that which has been designed for non-members. To get to the member information (details listed below), one has to sign in using their member ID and a password.

Member information has seven tabs all of which have a drop down menu (containing the items in parenthesis):

- MYDKG: (my account, apply/submit, forms, deadlines, communities, DKG Store, directory, chapter locator)
- RESOURCES (media, DKG officer, new member, and marketing)
- ABOUT (mission/vision/purposes, information on becoming a member, the DKG history, key initiatives, recognition, leaders, state organization and chapter websites)
- EVENTS (International conventions and conferences, related events, Go Ahead Tours, and the Centennial Celebration)
- PUBLICATIONS and DOCUMENTS (Constitution and ISR, DKG News, Bulletin Journal, Bulletin Magazine, Get Connected, Go-to-Guide, President's Page, Our Heritage, Board Actions Administrative and Executive, GAP, Strategic Plan, budget, archives)
- DKGIEF (about, funds, ways to contribute, blog, donate)
- LEADERSHIP DISCOVERY CENTRE (general resources: society and outside

## Dr. Annie Webb Blanton's Patience Candy

At the Executive Board/ General Session on Saturday, the new initiates received a gift of Patience Candy, Delta Kappa Gamma Founder Annie Webb Blanton's favorite. The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International has made the recipe available from A Texas Collection: East Texas, 1980.

Dr. Blanton loved to cook and was noted for her delicious hot biscuits, apple pies, sugared pecans and Patience Candy. Several members have requested this recipe. . . . It does take patience!

| 1 cup milk | 1 cup sugar |
| :--- | :--- |
| 2 cups sugar | 1 teaspoon vanilla |
| 1 tablespoon butter | 1 cup chopped pecans |
| $1 / 4$ cup Karo syrup |  |

Mix milk, 2 cups sugar, butter and Karo syrup in pan to boil slowly. Melt 1 cup sugar in a heavy skillet, stirring constantly, letting it brown slowly. Combine the two mixes and cook until mixture forms a soft ball ( $234-240^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ ). Remove from heat, beat until cool, adding vanilla while beating. Add pecans, pour into a buttered dish. Cut in squares when cool.
