So I am sharing an early reminder of some of the benefits that you can apply for as a member of DKG and Pennsylvania State. Just a reminder that these opportunities and deadlines are listed on the back of the schedule you were given for meetings in August and are posted on the website. Each award, grant, scholarship or honor is described in great detail on the dkgpa.weebly.com website. applications are now in word format. Each application has a rubric and guidelines for what they are looking for in your application and I highly suggest that you use that rubric and set of guidelines to write your proposal. If you need any help or assistance with writing your proposal or help submitting your proposal please don't hesitate to contact Becky or me.

The Nancy Grove Visionary Fund awards a grant to an in-service, active teacher member to fund innovative ideas and activities related to Excellence in Education within the educational community. The deadline to apply is February 1, 2023.

Enrichment Grants will be awarded to active members for three years in good standing who wish to enroll in an Elder hostel Program, continuing education for personal and professional growth, a travel/study tour, or to develop an approved independent study project, or to present a paper to a professional organization. The deadline to apply is February 1, 2023.

Scholarships will be offered to active members in good standing for three years who are taking graduate study for credit leading to an advanced degree, certification or toward job/self-improvement. The deadline to apply is February 1, 2023.

The Album of Distinction (AOD) award is given to recognize a member who has already received an honor or distinction beyond DKG between January 1, 2022-December 31, 2022. The deadline for this application is March 1, 2023. Applications can be sent to me – See email address in our chapter directory.

The Achievement Award is to honor a member's Delta Kappa Gamma leadership. The deadline to apply is March 15, 2023.

US Forum

The 2022-2024 US Forum Steering Committee was selected at the Delta Kappa Gamma International Convention held in New Orleans during July, 2022. The Northeast Representative is Beverly Johns from Illinois.

The Mental Health Resolution passed at the US Forum meeting on 7-16-22. It recognizes mental health issues for educational staff and promotes support services. This resolution recognizes that the current state of mental health among children, youth, and educators in this nation imperils goals for educational excellence.

Pandemic related demands have placed tremendous stress on educators.

Data indicated 37% of educators have generalized anxiety disorder symptoms as compared to pre-pandemic levels of 12.6% and 57% of educators are seriously worried about burnout.

Legislation has been introduced in both houses of Congress to increase mental health supports for students but none has addressed support for educators. The Delta Kappa Gamma International US Forum members resolve to educate themselves on the issues and needs related to mental health for educational staff. They resolve to inform members of current legislation related to mental health services for educators.

The US Forum Steering Committee will monitor the implementation of mental health activities and issue a report summarizing activities at the 2024 US Forum meeting.
