President's Message

The year was 1980 something. I was in Anchorage, Alaska to present at an adult education conference. One of the keynote speakers was Dr. Leo Buscaglia. At the time, Dr. Buscaglia was a very popular professor at the University of Southern California. I had been hearing a lot about this dynamic person for a while and was anxious to experience his message first hand. I was not disappointed. He truly was motivating and inspiring. What I remember most about his session was his invitation to everyone to "come on down" and get a hug from him. I stood in line for my hug and again, I was not disappointed. His hugs were on par with my Uncle Army who until that point, in my opinion, gave the best hugs in the world. What made the hug as special as my uncle's was its strength ("bear-like" quality), its warmth, its genuineness, and its length.

Dr. Buscaglia said, "Too often we underestimate the power of a touch, a smile, a kind word, a listening ear, an honest compliment, or the smallest act of caring, all of which have the potential to turn a life around." Those words reverberated throughout my mind during my hug moment with the famed man for the power of his touch/hug, his smile, and the few words he shared with me did make a lasting impression on me.

Turning lives around. In a way, that is what we do in DKG. Through our support of early career educators and our members active in the field, we help make a difference for them and for the students they teach. Our Grant-in Aid program (which will be featured at our March meeting) provides financial support for a soon-to-be early career educator. Our community service projects (Fleece Blankets, Weekend Backpack Program, Toastie Tootsies, STEM work with our Girl Scout Troop) and our support of our long-distance school (Jabulani School) in Zimbabwe, Africa are making a

positive difference for so many near and far and no doubt are turning lives around. And, what we do internally to support each other is the ultimate in terms of caring and compassion.

The DKG Core Values are at the heart of what we do. The work of the chapter truly reflects the seven purposes of DKG. Every time I reflect on all that you are doing, I hear Dr. Buscaglia also saying, "The majority of us lead quiet, unheralded lives as we pass through this world. There will most likely be no ticker-tape parades for us, no monuments created in our honor. But that does not lessen our possible impact, for there are scores of people waiting for someone just like us to come along; people who will appreciate our compassion, our unique talents. Someone who will live a happier life merely because we took the time to share what we had to give." I look forward to the continued happiness we will bring to those around us, to the difference we will make in the lives of students and teachers, and to turning lives around...to the Alpha Beta ripple effect that will continue to spread far and wide.

Legislative Updates as of December 2020

S.1160 Supporting Family Mental Health in CAPTA Act increases support for mental health and child abuse prevention and treatment. Passed the Senate. Sent to the House and held on desk.

HR 5717 Gun Violence Prevention and Community Safety Act of 2020 aims to toughen Federal Firearms laws. Referred to the House Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism and Homeland Security.

S. 2661 National Suicide Designation Act of 2020 became Public Law No. 116-172 on October 17, 2020. The universal hotline number for suicide prevention and mental health crises is **9-8-8**.
